Serving 43 schools in the region, ~22,000 students.

Growth in Okanagan significant and no expectation for that to end any time soon. Reviewed the financial income sources: specifically the operating funds. \$214 million in operating revenue for 2018.

New 'Special Purpose Fund,' \$13 million, to implement the Supreme Court decision (namely to accommodate class size and make-up, increase non-enrolling teachers). In the works: BC Education Funding Model Review
