- 2. Given official yes that can prepare concept images with Indigenous Space. Moving forward will have to raise money but can start process.

- 4. Grade 12's happy to have Winter Formal this year. Policy on who will be allowed to attend, eg. dates. Don't know the answer yet and will report back as soon as this information is given.
- 5. Indigenous 4 credit course (one semester) to graduate starting next year; KSS to offer "contemporary studies", and then English "First Peoples"; in future will be offered through 10-12. During COPAC meeting, TerriLee Beaudry that external credits for Indigenous Students for Indigenous Skills. Is this a pathway to graduation? This whole thing is evolving and KSS will be responsive to this new credit prerequisite.

 - Gift cards to support high-priority families over winter break are being purchased
 - Increase in breakfast and brown bag lunches, also including some higher-priced items
 - Increased funding for the backpack food program
 - Increased support for indigenous and refugee families
 - High-priority schools have had fees waived.
