Approval of previous meeting minutes – October 12, 2021: motion to approve by Valary, seconded by Abbey, all in favour

Principal's Report - Troy White

- 1. Hold and Secure today. Letter out about an incident from external schools coming to KSS to meet. Students who were allegedly going to fight did not show up; had RCMP support; because so many other students from other schools were there, held a "hold and secure" 10 minutes before lunch was over. Other students from other locations went away. Safe at school and it was exceptionally done. Information was out for parents, staff, media quickly and at the same time. Still working on this with RCMP.
- 2. Remembrance Day is tomorrow. Typically outside, but have not been able to do it due to COVID, so doing it inside again. Using the hallways again. Portables will do it on ZOOM, but doing what can.
- 3. PT conferences Oct 13; Earthquake Drill; Fire Drill; Oct 22 Pro-D day went very well (Troy went to Spotted Lake); Wes Barker performance came in, but due to restrictions, did not work as well as it could have. (ZOOM is not best for this type of performance); Math/Numeracy in 10/12 assessments done the last week; Nov 4th Dry Grad Prom meeting and about 98 parents on ZOOM meeting and gave update of what will be able to be done. Voice from parents and students to see what they want to do. Will have three plans in place to help ensure celebrations take place.

- 4. Q1 ends on Friday, Q2 begins on Monday. Nov 25th report cards sent home. This year will be giving out RC's virtually, in all Q...other than Q4. This is done to ensure books returned. Information will be sent home to parents. Go online to KSS website, bottom of page and go to blue box. Type in: stu23student.name and then password. Open Student portal. Two places that can see timetable. Ask your student to open and show report cards, and can print up. Parent portal is not available yet. Paper options always available, if needed. Can look at achievement indicators and work ethic. Have not done GPA or Work Ethic due to COVID. Can do it online, but not on piece of paper. On Q2 and Q3, still won't do it. It is online for those who would like to work it out themselves. There is an opportunity to acknowledge those students who have achieved high work ethic.
- 5. Jr Boys an Sr Boys Provincial tournaments: volleyball coming up and will be streaming games online. Sr girls was supposed to be up north, but moved to Lower Mainland due to high COVID numbers. North will have option to have them again next year. Some districts don't have travel. Different rules for community and Interior events for schools.
- 6. Things going well at school. High stress amongst parents, students, staff...but doing best and working hard.
- 7. Have opened up another single-use public bathroom (universal washroom) in the school. Need to be inclusive. Getting clarity for camera. Installed a camera and would like to open another camera up to ensure safety for all. Has been pointed down hallway and is not pointed directly at the washroom. The only ones who have access are Admin and only access is granted to admin. After 30 days, the feed is erased. As soon as enter property, there is knowledge that there are cameras on site for everyone who is on site. No one looks at feed unless there is an issue reported to administration. Support for all students is the intention.

- Proposed 2021-2022 PAC Budget:
 - 1. \$7,772.00 set aside from last year to be used still.
 - 2. *See KSS PAC 2021-2022 Gaming Requests spreadsheet. Took all requests and grouped into categories. Numbers in "green" could change.
 - 3. Go over the ones in question: Enviro Club field trips \$1000, YES; Debate Club \$500, for going to Provincials (23-25 students), YES; Math Club \$1403, extracurricular, multiple tests, many students who will be taking it, does it every year, YES; Satellite phone is funded by school; Robotics Club, specified kits needed, any amount allocated will be appreciated, goes for competitions and this is initial stages of Club, \$750 and they can apply for more later, YES; Applied Skills/Tech \$731, School will pay for the saw, we pay for the boxes; Football OK'd 25% at \$2,100, YES; Dance Fitness and Locally Adapted PE to join together, guest instructors/equipment, combined request: \$2,500 (275+ students at least would benefit), YES; Graduation \$430, tablecloths and puck lights, (lights \$218 for 18 HD lights), Lori can get tablecloths at no cost to borrow, YES to amount of \$220
