



Almost all KSS students will have MORE than the minimum 80 credits as 'insurance' to protect graduation. Grade 12's must also meet the Indigenous Graduation requirement by taking ONE Indigenous focused course.

Literacy 10, Numeracy 10, and Grade 12 Literacy assessments are required for graduation.
French Immersion students must also write the French Language Literacy 12 assessment.

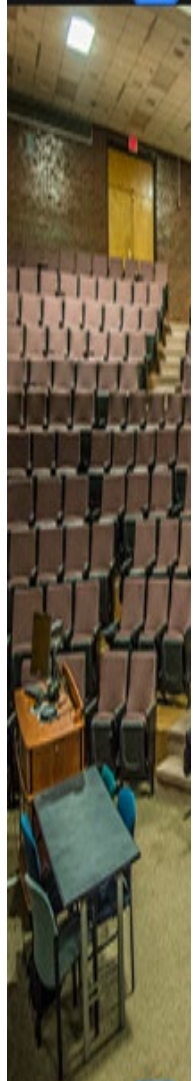
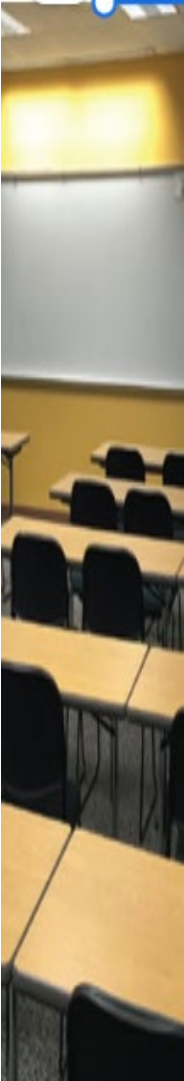

Entrance Averages: Okanagan College

- Application opened on Oct. 1st
- Most programs are first apply, first admitted and do not have specific entrance averages

Exceptions:

- Certified Dental Assisting → Application criteria
- Practical nursing → Applicants are ranked

UBC: What's NEW?

- **NO GENERAL Grade 11 ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS**

(NOT in Vancouver, NOT in Okanagan)

- No 2nd language entrance requirements (BOTH campuses)
- No general math requirements (BOTH campuses)

*** Certain programs may require specific grade 11/12 courses so it is important to check program requirements for the degree & campus you plan to attend*

- **Bachelor of COMMERCE** now available at **BOTH campuses**

- *UBC-O formerly offered a Bachelor of Management but that program has closed in favour of COMMERCE*

Focus less on listing / describing activities.

Focus instead on what you have learned through these experiences, on how you have grown.

REFLECTIVE THOUGHT CAN MAKE THE DIFFERENCE!

**** Remember, one of your referees/references MUST be able to speak to at least one of your activities, and one referee must be a school official.**

- Ongoing admissions process
- Can apply early October - Jan. 15th
- Offers will be made on an ongoing basis from Oct. - March/April. Some require a second review and need more time for UBC to decide.
- Apply by Dec. 1st for scholarship consideration

DO NOT RUSH YOUR APPLICATION!

UBC is NOT a first apply, first admitted school. Admission is unrelated to when you apply. **Students who submit right at the deadline get equal consideration as those who apply earlier.**

Planning to Study in the USA?

- You may need to write the SAT test OR the ACT. Contact your school to find what test may be needed.
- Can do the test as many times as you like
- SAT info & registrations: www.sat.org (\$111 US +)
- ACT info & registrations: www.act.org (\$186.50 US +)



Plan ahead carefully as there are limited test dates and limited test locations in B.C.. Registering ahead of time is critically important.

KSS Runs as an SAT Location! Next session is November 8th.

Tips for Applying Online

- Plan ahead what program (& campus - if applicable)
- Set aside uninterrupted time to complete the application
- **Have your PEN number and SIN number handy**
**** your PEN (Personal Education Number) is the 9 digit # on the upper left hand corner of all BC report cards)**
- Application fee payment is due at the time of application so you'll also need to have a credit card handy.

Tips for Applying Online

- **Know your full mailing address with postal code**
- Email address needs to be the one you check the most frequently and will have after high school (*not your school district account).
- **Email will be the primary method of communication from post-secondary institutions.**
- Apply as early as possible for OC
- **Check your email regularly and make sure post-secondary information isn't in junk folder or filters.**

Why Apply Early?

Please apply as soon as possible because:

1. Some college programs are “first apply, first in” and some programs may fill up very quickly.
2. If the post-secondary institution requires additional information from you, you then have the time to fulfill their requests.
3. Some programs require supplemental applications that take time to complete.
4. Some schools allow students to choose courses based on application date. Therefore, if you are late in applying, you may not get the classes you want.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Your **Grade 11 final grades AND your Grade 12 First Semester final grades** are used by the post secondary schools to determine admission acceptance. (ie: UBC, SFU, UVIC)
- ALL offers are conditional. Students should maintain grades within 2% all year long (or improve) to keep an offer of admission.
- Keep working as hard as you can throughout the school year as admissions offers are conditional until all final grades are received in late July from the BC Ministry of Education.
- **Be sure to complete your [Student Transcripts Service \(STS\)](#) ASAP. Add all the PSI's that you think you may apply to. You can go back to the site at any time to add a PSI to your list.**

DISABILITIES and POST-SECONDARY

- Most institutions have an office specifically for supporting students with **DOCUMENTED** challenges: learning disabilities, physical disabilities, mental health, and/or ongoing medical conditions.
- They can help create accommodations in classes for students relevant to the disability.
- Plan ahead to organize the documents you need. (ie: from a qualified professional such as a doctor's report)
- Process takes time so start early. Students should contact your PSI by June so accommodations can be set up for when school starts in September.

WARNING: ONLINE COURSES

Taking an online course for post-secondary entrance:

- Differing deadlines posted by individual Post Secondary Institutions to complete online courses. Check with your institution to verify dates!
NOTE: Your PSI may require you to complete the course sooner than the online school requires.
- UBC recommends completing online courses for admissions by March 1st regardless of when you apply so they have the grade to include in deciding your admission
- Make certain your online school reports your marks to the Ministry of Education so your marks are part of the StudentTranscripts data transfer.
- **Speak with your post-secondary institution for any special circumstances or questions about online courses!**

- Transcripts are sent electronically to post-secondary institutions according to the SEND OPTION that the PSI has chosen.
- Do not adjust the default send option and/or date range the post-secondary school has already set.

Example: "Send my transcript now and allow this post-secondary Institution to request updates until the date specified below" (*can be a 1 year timeline)

****DO NOT SELECT:**

"Send my transcript electronically now" or "Send my printed transcript now" as these selections are for students who have already graduated

NOTES:

- An Institution may ask for early interim transcripts which you can request one from our Counselling Center.
- An Institution may ask you to self report your grades based on your report card marks. These self reported grades will be verified when the school receives your transcript from the STS in May and then in July.
- If you are taking some time off to work and travel, you will need to use the STS site to access and send your transcripts to PSI's after graduation.
- See your school counsellor if you have any questions.



What shows on your Transcript?

A transcript is a document of successfully completed courses with final marks.

- > Transcripts are different than learning updates.
- > Transcripts do not show failures.
- > Transcripts do not show withdrawals.
- > Transcripts do not show GPA.
- > Final Transcripts do not show duplicate courses.
- * *If you repeat a course, only the higher mark will show on the final transcript.*

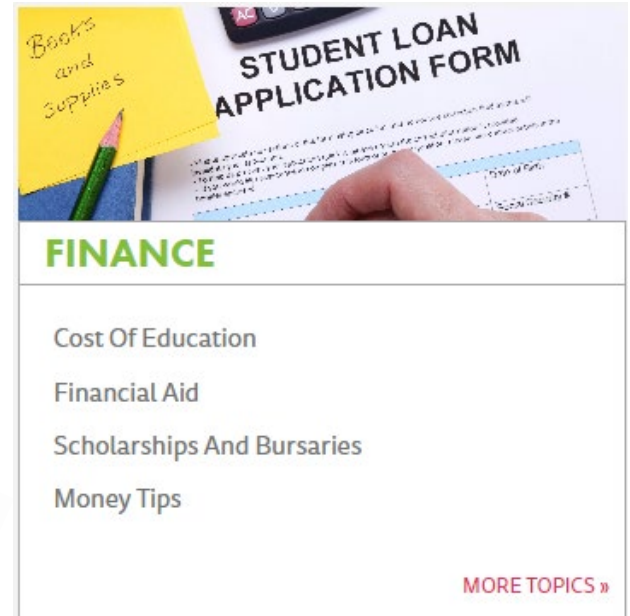
Post secondary education is expensive and students should seek out any assistance available to them. There are many bursaries and scholarships available to grade 12 students. A bursary is usually based on financial need whereas a scholarship is based on excellence in some area – the arts, athletics, languages etc. Unlike student loans (which not all students qualify for), bursaries and scholarships are non-repayable awards. Every bursary or scholarship has its own criteria and deadline which have been established by the donor(s).

There are many other awards available to grade 12s that do not come through the school. We always recommend that students check scholarship websites, parents' workplaces, post-secondary institutions they are applying to and associations and organizations with which parents or grandparents are affiliated.
