



#### Application deadlines - Canadian Students

Canadian students must  $\underline{apply}$  to  $\underline{UBC}$  by  $\underline{December}$  1, 2021 if they wish to be considered for:

- First round offers of admission
- Presidential Scholars Awards
- <u>Centennial Scholars Entrance Awards</u> (supplemental application also due Dec. 1)
- Beyond Tomorrow Scholars Program (supplemental application also due Dec. 1).

The final deadline for all other applications is January 15, 2022.
