Dr. Brad Baker, Ministry of Education Superintendent of Indigenous Education visited École Kelowna Secondary School on Wednesday, December 4th. Dr. Baker toured our Gathering Room and met with our Indigenous Leadership Teacher Assistants, who shared a presentation of the development of this new course. The project began as an idea after they attended the Okanagan Mainline Regional Indigenous Education Council's 2nd Annual Student Summit, focusing on Anti-Racism. At the Summit, students, Ava Cudmore, Dilynn Scott and Kaylie Gross told their Vice-Principal, Mrs. Christey Hughes and their Indigenous Advocate, Mrs. Esmae Rothfusz, that student voice needs to continue to be elevated and that they have the capacity to support educators in their classrooms with cultural offerings, advocacy and their individual perspectives. Alongside several staff members at KSS, the students developed the course. Their mentors helped construct a syllabus and the course was proposed. Beginning September 2024, the Indigenous Leadership TA course has been offered at KSS and several classes have benefited from the TAs' presence and offerings.

During Dr. Baker's visit to KSS this week, **Ava**, **Dilynn** and **Kaylie**, along with fellow student, **Libby** Reis, highlighted their leadership development and their school-wide offerings that support student identity and development of intercultural competencies. KSS teachers sign-up via a Google Form to request visits from the TAs who bring offering to their classes such as: Lanyard Beading, Hoop Earring Beading, Brick Stitch Beading, Drumming, Lah'al, Elder Support, Circle Protocol, 7 Grandfather Teachings. Teachers are always present and engaged when the TAs bring offerings into classrooms. Participating students receive TA credits towards their Dogwood Diplomas.

A few comments from teachers after the TAs attended their classes to support in learning:
