SCHOOL FEES

The fastest and easier way to pay school fees is on-line. Given the current COVID pandemic, the fact that the District is not anticipating providing the same level of cultural performances as we have in the past and students are not using lockers, Student Activity Fees will not be charged for the upcoming school year.

Opportunity to purchase a **Yearbook** has also been added on to student accounts in order to take advantage of early bird pricing. Please log on to your child's account at School Cash Online to see the options available. It is strongly suggested that all fees are paid on-line as an automatic receipt is generated and proof of payment is always available. Deadline for early bird purchase of \$30.00 is December 1st! The regular price will be \$35.00 and the deadline to purchase is February 28. **A huge SHOUTOUT to Ms. Nicoll and the Yearbook Class for the amazing job they do on creating our Yearbook full of great memories.**

GRAD FEES

The 75.00 **Grade 12 Graduation Ceremony Fee** has been added to the Grade 12 students and expires April 1st. These fees cover grad photo sitting and complimentary photo at commencement, keepsake grad photo composite, grad gown rental, keepsake grad cap, and rental of the venue and security OR a professionally-produced virtual ceremony. These fees are not refundable. Our 2020 Virtual ceremony and all graduation paraphernalia used ALL of the collected funds so 2021 fees have remained the same.

We are hosting two information nights which interested individuals may attend.

The Lady of the Lake candidacy program is six months of weekly training sessions from January to July. Our program is completely free because of our community sponsors.

The training focuses on:

- financial management

- area knowledge and Okanagan tourism
- and so much more!

During the six months, the candidates participate in countless volunteer events across the community. Where they are able to gain volunteer hours for school. At the end we also give way 7 different bursaries to our candidates. (Value between \$500 and \$1000)

REGISTRATION HOW-TO:

- 1. Click on the registration link to create an account.
- 2. Fill in all mandatory fields.
- 3. Make sure you remember your e-mail and chosen password for the platform! You'll need it to log in.
- "Programs of Interest" -> you are only able to select one option. Don't worry, you can get information
 about any program you wish. Just choose the one you are leaning towards at this moment.
- Email address → use an email you will frequently check. Recruiters may need to follow up with you
 after the fair to answer your questions or send you information.
- Date & Time → Select your preferred date and time for Kelowna/Vernon/Okanagan secondary schools
 or for a Provincial Community Event.

NOTES & HELPFUL TIPS:

- Some PSIs will have more recruiters available for their local students.
- YES, you can sign up for both Oct. 5th and 6th plus any community events.
- · YES, parents can sign up too!
- Recruiters and representatives are only available during the fair times.
- YES, you can still go into the booths of PSIs outside of fair times, you will be limited to downloading
 information and looking at the booth. Generally fairs are scheduled for the afternoons and evenings so
 if you need to get a document or take a look at a booth, the best option is to do that in morning.
- Please do NOT sign up for events outside of our region or the community events.

IT'S BACK!



Hi there KSS students, parents, and guardians! Did you know that according to recent UNICEF numbers, an estimated 16,000,000 children under the age of 5 years old around the world suffer from Severe Acute Malnutrition? These numbers have also been seen to be spiking across the globe due to the distress of the Covid-19 pandemic. This is where an initiative called Move4MANA enters. The Move4MANA Challenge is an initiative meant to inspire kids to get active in order to help spread awareness and create resources for those suffering from Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM). It is our goal to help lessen this number of starving kids and help them have a chance at a bright future. The initiative is simple, through the app Active For Good, we ask students to log their activity daily which takes less than 5 minutes. That activity is then calculated into Good Points and after a certain amount of Good Points, it will equal one RUTF packet. RUTF stands for Ready to Use Therapeutic Food and is a vitamin and protein packed peanut based food product that will be delivered to our target country after the challenge is over. Kids suffering from SAM that consumed this product three times a day for six weeks saw a dramatic increase in overall health and well-being. As this is the second year we are bringing this challenge to KSS, the results from last year's challenge were truly amazing. As a community, KSS saved 300 lives last year and we are aiming to save even more lives this year. This all depends on our involvement, so please help us help the world
