YEAR END PROCEDURES - New!

Mark your calendars!

As we return to a 'new normal' this school year, hard Copy **final Report Cards** will be distributed in **Homeroom** on **Thursday**, **June 29 from 9:00—10:30 a.m.** Buses are running.

Students must pay all outstanding fees and have returned library books and textbooks by this date in order to receive their Report Card. Students that had outstanding fees or books would have been given an overdue statement at Locker Cleanout Homeroom on June 19th. If you are unsure if you have outstanding fees, you may check your School Cash Online account HERE. Students will be able to take care of fees up to, and including, June 29th.

Report Cards will not be published in MyEd or mailed home. Students that are unable to pick up their Report Card on June 29th may come to the main office the following week on July 4-6 between 9:00 a.m.—3:00 p.m. to pick up.

Important Information for Grads:

- ⇒ **Transfer your data!** You must download or transfer your personal SD23 GSuite data by the end of June.
 - Option 1: Download or transfer your SD23 GSuite data (if you are the 'Owner') see HERE.
 - Option 2: Download all of your files see HERE.
- ⇒ Due July 7: Final Post-Secondary Institution (PSI) Selections for 2023 Graduates

Final transcripts will be released by July 31. To ensure timely delivery to your selected PSIs, students should make their selections in the StudentTranscripts Service (STS) by July 7. See the following page for more information.

- ⇒ **Grade 12 Final Transcripts**. Students will not be mailed a final transcript from the BC Ministry of Education. Students must order their own transcript copies through the Student Transcript Service <u>LINK</u>. The \$10 transcript fee is waived for the first printed transcript order placed within six months after graduation.
- ⇒ **Dogwoods** will be available for pick-up at the KSS office starting the last week of August.

Student Post-Secondary Institution (PSI) Selections – July 7

June 16, 2023

By **July 7, 2023,** Grade 12 and adult students are encouraged to visit the <u>StudentTranscripts Service</u> (STS) to preauthorize release of their final transcript data to their chosen post-secondary institutions (PSIs) for admissions purposes.

Current students may make up to 25 PSI selections free of charge, generally up to six months after completing their last course. They are also entitled to order one free printed transcript (by mail) after graduation, which can be sent to any address they choose. All other transcript orders in STS (including PDF transcripts) are \$10 each.

Distribution of Final Transcripts

As of May 2023, student graduation status is updated nightly on transcripts, based on the latest data reported by schools. For distribution purposes, transcripts are not considered final until the Ministry has released June Assessment session results by July 31. How and when students' final transcripts are sent will depend on the PSI and the options selected by students in the STS:

- <u>22 B.C. PSIs, 23 Alberta colleges and universities, and the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC)</u> can request transcript updates electronically throughout the year (when authorized by the student)*
- <u>Six B.C. PSIs and University of Alberta</u> will receive final marks through a batch electronic data transfer sent by July 31 (followed by weekly updates until early September)
- All other PSIs will receive paper transcripts, which will be processed by July 31st (typically arriving by mail at PSIs in the first week of August, or later, depending on the location)

"Send Now" option

If a student has carefully reviewed their transcript and are satisfied that it is complete and accurate, they can also choose the send 'now' option to send their most current transcript to a selected PSI at any time.

*Important: If a student's selected PSI is capable of receiving ongoing electronic updates (i.e., XML transcripts), the student should choose the second option to "Send my transcript now and allow this Post-Secondary Institution to request transcript updates until the date specified below." It is also recommended that they leave the authorization period set to the default date of one year.

For Schools: PSI Selections - Student Summary Report

On the <u>School Secure Web</u>, the "PSI Selections – Student Summary Report" (available under the "Post-Secondary Reports" link) is updated weekly until mid-July. Schools can use the report to confirm students' selected PSIs and identify those students who may be known by the school to be applying to a PSI but haven't made a selection in STS.

STUDENTS SEEK DONATIONS FOR INDIGENOUS INQUIRY PROJECT

Kelowna, BC – The Truth and Reconciliation Advisory Committee at École Kelowna Secondary School (KSS) is looking for contributions from the community to help fund their Outdoor Classroom Project.

A dedicated group of student leaders from the KSS Indigenous Academy continues to pass the torch of their Indigenous Inquiry Project, and they are now fundraising to make the outdoor learning space a reality. Graduating Leadership student Amelie Guignard had the idea of spreading the fundraising effort beyond the school.


"With the Indigenous course requirement opportunities coming in the next school year, an outdoor classroom is a perfect space for some of the learning to occur," says Guignard, who is also Métis. "As a graduate, I'm glad to know the work on this project will continue to benefit future students and help the journey toward Truth and Reconciliation."

The purposes of the project are to bridge all students with the land, honour local Indigenous teachings, create a welcoming outdoor gathering space, and partner with people interested in being a part of Reconciliation. Planning included consultation with local Indigenous elders to ensure the space includes Indigenous ways of knowing and being.

"The value of this Outdoor Classroom lies in its profound ability to mend the cracks within our often-fragmented community," says Abdalla Tall, Grade 11 Leadership student. "Like a meticulous tapestry, it holds the potential to stitch distinct perspectives and cultures together with threads of understanding and empathy. I genuinely hope this space will be pivotal toward Truth and Reconciliation."

Donations to the project can be <u>made through School Cash Online</u>, which ensures that all funds go directly to the project with no fees. Donors can register with an email to receive a charitable tax receipt, then click "Make a Donation" and choose "KSS Indigenous Inquiry Project" as a Fund Destination. 
KSS Indigenous Outdoor Classroom Concept (below)

RE: 2024-2025 School Calendar

(The 2023-2024 School Calendar is established and available to view at www.sd23.bc.ca.)

Dear Parents/Guardians and School Community:

The Ministry of Education passed Bill 36, the School Amendment Act, which eliminated the Standard School Calendar. As a result, school districts are now required to establish their own school calendars. The Calendar Committee is comprised of representatives of the partner groups in the Central Okanagan Public Schools, including the Central Okanagan Teachers' Association (C.O.T.A.), Canadian Union of Public Employees Local 3523 (C.U.P.E.), Central Okanagan Principals' and Vice Principals' Association (COPVPA), and the Central Okanagan Parent Advisory Council (COPAC). This committee has met to draft a proposed 2024/2025 school calendar (attached), which meets the requirements of Bill 36.

Section 87.01 (7) of the School Act requires consultation on school calendars. A board must make public a proposed school calendar one month before submitting it to the Ministry. We are inviting the community to review the proposed calendar for the 2024/2025 school year and to provide input to the proposal before it is discussed by our Board of Education at a public meeting.

I invite you to provide your input about this proposal by Friday, June 30, 2023, by completing a very brief survey at the link below:

We anticipate that the finalized 2024/2025 school calendar (once approved by the Board of Education) will be provided to parents early this fall. Copies will be provided directly to you through your child's school.
