TRUTH & RECONCILATION WEEK SEPTEMBER 25-29

Kelowna Secondary School's Truth and Reconciliation Advisory Committee was formed last year. As Truth and Reconciliation is on our minds on a regular basis, we have a student-driven committee that works with supporting staff and students enrolled in the Indigenous Academy on two major initiatives in our school:

- -The upcoming Truth and Reconciliation Week (September 25-29, 2023).
- -The KSS Outdoor Classroom Project.

Truth and Reconciliation Week

Each year, September 30th marks the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. The day honours the children who never returned home and the survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

At KSS, we organized our first Truth and Reconciliation Week two years ago to honour Canada's first National Truth and Reconciliation Day. A number of events took place throughout the week, including discussions about residential schools in classes, gatherings of students, and an emphasis on the Calls to Action. Next week, the Indigenous Academy is focusing on a theme for each day, listed below. Bannock will be available for sale on Tuesday!

Monday – Truth
Tuesday – Reflection
Wednesday – Healing
Thursday – Resilience and Reconciliation
Friday – Orange Shirt Day at KSS

Monday, October 2nd— NO SCHOOL, in lieu of National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

We will WEAR ORANGE on Friday, September 29th. The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations. Please wear orange on this day to honour the thousands of survivors of residential schools. We will be having a symbolic 215 seconds of silence on Friday, after the morning announcements. Students have prepared some information for teachers to offer to their classes, along with some reflective activities.






Swim Team sign-up is on Sept 26th at 11:45 a.m. In Room 193.

Empowering YOU is a 10-week program that provides mental health education to help young adults develop skills that enable them to cope with challenges in life. The ultimate aim of Empowering YOU is to help youth aged 14 to 17 to manage stress, moments of anxiety, mood challenges, and relationship difficulties through self-awareness, coping strategies (e.g., mindfulness), connecting with nature and physical activity.

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The goal of this program is to develop a sense of connection and belonging among participants in the 10-week program while learning about tools and techniques to manage their mental health. The program will run once a week for two hours. The first hour is dedicated to learning and information. During the second hour, vouth engage in physical activity which gives them an opportunity to experience and practice the information and learning. The program builds largely on the work of Jill Rathus and Alec Miller (2015) and dialectical behaviour therapy (DBT) and more specifically their DBT Skills Manual for Adolescents.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

The overarching guiding principle for Empowering You is to create a safe space by:

- Creating and supporting positive experiences and peer relationships.
- Ensuring programming is standardized, ageappropriate and builds on best practice.
- Incorporating and practicing emotional, physical and mental risk management.
- Practicing strength based and trauma informed approaches to facilitation

PARTICIPANTS

Empowering YOU is a program for youth, aged 14 to 17, including youth in care or aging out of care, to assist with managing stress, moments of anxiety, mood challenges and relationship difficulties.
