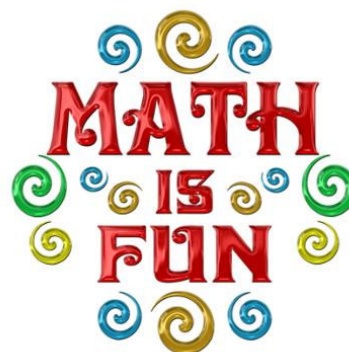

International Education is currently looking for host families for Kelowna Secondary (KSS) students. Families with school aged children, residing in a single family home are encouraged to apply at their earliest convenience.

- **Host families for 2 boys from China arriving February 2021**

- **Host families for girls arriving April 2021**

Since September, Central Okanagan Public Schools has welcomed 282 international students into local schools. In Canada over 15,000 K-12 students have arrived safely, followed all quarantine measures, and are attending schools across the country. Students are required to submit a negative COVID-19 test taken within 72 hours of their departure from home country. There have been no cases of COVID-19 linked to international student travelers arriving to Canada to date. Canada's border remains open for students with study permits and international students travelling to our school district do so under the requirements of governments and health authorities.

THE SEL SCOOP – January 2021

Supporting your Child Socially and Emotionally

Special Edition: Managing Big Feelings!

For many reasons beyond our control, life can feel stressful right now. Here are a few tips to help your children manage when big and uncomfortable feelings show up:

Talk about Emotions

Being able to identify, name, and talk about feelings reduces input from the emotion center of the brain and increases input from the thinking and problem solving center of the brain. It is also helpful to practice noticing emotions as physical sensations (literally, feelings!).



Listen and Empathize

Validate their feelings, judgement free – all feelings are okay, but all behaviour is not! You don't have to agree with what they might be feeling, but it is important to listen and respect it. Ask open-ended questions ("tell me what that feels like", "tell me more"). Ask prompting questions "what do you think would happen if...?"



Acknowledge your own Feelings

It's helpful for children to see that everyone struggles, even grown-ups. Model talking about feelings, talking about how feelings show up in the body, thinking through solutions, and using healthy coping strategies that make problems better, not worse! Choose self-disclosures carefully and keep adults worries in the hands of adults!



Reframe Feelings as Messages

Feelings are simply pieces of information that we have the power to choose what to do with. We don't want to ignore feelings but we don't want to respond impulsively to them either. Help them learn to interpret the message – stop and think, and make a good choice.



Reframe Stress & Encourage a Growth Mindset

Help children shift from a "stress hurts" to a "stress helps" mindset. Stress, big or small, presents opportunities for growth and learning. Even though a situation can't always be fixed, every situation can be improved – help them identify the powers they have to influence things.



Notice What They are Doing Well

Praise effort more than outcome. When offering positive feedback, be specific (identifying a clear desired behaviour that you would like to see repeated) and legitimate (following purposeful and meaningful accomplishments or actions and contributions). Encourage your child to think of how far he or she has come rather than how far he or she still needs to go. Help them see what they ~~can~~ do!



What we Give Attention to Grows

What we focus on, we get more of – choosing to focus on the positives, the learning opportunities, what is within our control, and the ways that we can make a small improvement in a given situation is empowering!



Teach and Practice Problem Solving Skills

What am I feeling? What is the problem? What are the possible solutions? What would happen if...? (weigh the pros and cons). What will I try? Did it work? Practice stress management techniques such as deep breathing, distraction, movement, and positive self-talk.



Talk Openly About Change

Remind your child of a time when they successfully coped with a major change, limitation, or uncomfortable situation in the past (starting a new school, joining a new team). How did it feel, how did they cope, how did it end?

Complete the online application as early as possible, and provide the required documents listed below directly to the school by email by **Friday, March 12, 2021**.

1. **Birth certificate** or other government issued proof of age and citizenship
2. **Proof of B.C. Residency**
 - a. BC driver's license of parent/legal guardian AND
 - b. BC CARE card of parent/legal guardian OR
 - c. Other supporting documentation - <http://www.sd23.bc.ca/DistrictInfo/schoolenrollment/>
3. **Proof of Student's Living Address**
 - a. Property ownership, lease or rental agreement OR recent utility bill

AFTER Thursday, September 2, 2021

New in-catchment area enrollments: Parents will be notified by a confirmation email when the school has accepted the student's application for enrollment. Board Policy 405R – Student Placement (Regulations), will be used to determine student placement and priority.

New out-of-catchment area enrollments: Parents may not be notified until after the summer enrollment period is over and all in-catchment area students have been placed.

Qualifying age: The School Act requires that a child must be five years of age by December 31, 2021 to qualify for school enrollment in September 2021. No exceptions.

Dear Parents/Guardians and School Community:

The Ministry of Education passed Bill 36, the School Amendment Act, which eliminated the Standard School Calendar. As a result, school districts are now required to establish their own school calendars. The calendar committee is comprised of representatives of the partner groups in the Central Okanagan Public Schools including the Central Okanagan Teachers' Association (C.O.T.A.), Canadian Union of Public Employees Local 3523 (C.U.P.E.), Central Okanagan Principals and Vice Principals' Association (COPVPA), and the Central Okanagan Parent Advisory Council (COPAC). This committee has met to draft a proposed school calendar (attached), which meets the requirements of Bill 36.

Section 87.01 (7) of the School act requires consultation on school calendars. A board must make public a proposed school calendar one month before submitting it to the Ministry. We are inviting the community to review the proposed calendar for the 2021/2022 school year and to provide input to the proposal before it is discussed by our Board of Education at a public meeting.

I invite you to provide your input about this proposal by Friday, February 19, 2021 by completing a very brief survey at the link below:

We anticipate that the finalized 2021/2022 school calendar (once approved by the Board of Education) will be provided to parents early this spring. A copy will be provided directly to you through your child's school.
