- 1. Adoption of the Agenda agenda adopted by Valary Chidwick

3. Principal's Report - Scott McLean

- Parent Teacher interviews were held on March 2nd from 4:30-6:30 pm. Scott looking for feedback on the change in time (one less hour). Some parents work until 5 or 5:30 even 6:00 and find it hard to get there in time to see all the teachers. Others said that there were more parents packed into a shorter time and the line-ups were longer making it harder to get to see all the teachers in the time available. Suggestion that teachers limit time with interview if there is a line-up.
- Junior Achievement BC Innovation Jam 2016 took place in Vancouver a month ago and our business students (Dominique Murdoch, Claudia Lauretta, Claire Demug, Jeremy Gagne and Jordan MacDonald) took first prize for their "Gardening to Give" idea.
- Basketball Provincials; all KSS teams made it to provincials. Senior boys off to Provincials this weekend in Langley. Ranked number 1 in BC.
- Superintendent Kevin Kaardal also a director for BC Basketball Association will be attending Provincials and invited Scott to go with him.
- Course selections now complete. Course selections will be printed and sent home in May for review and confirmation.
- School District 23 budget has been reduced by 3.5 million ... not sure how it will affect KSS but will definitely have an effect.
- Air Band underway this week with lunch hour performances and finale scheduled for Thursday evening March 10th. Mr. Triggs and Mr. Sodaro have put a lot of time into organizing the event and students have been practicing morning/noon and night.
- French Immersion Task Force has done a lot of work and put a lot of thought into proposed scenarios for a model that is sustainable going forward. Discussions have included portable placement at middle school, early and late entry to the program and an intensive French program as an alternative to the Dual Dogwood.
- Questions from parents were addressed regarding the recent announcement that KSS students are no longer allowed in the College Cafeteria. Decision was made by KSS administration due to the number of incidents they have been called in to deal with.
