Weekend Backpack Program for Children in the Central Okanagan!

Impact Tomorrow Foundation ("ITF") is pleased to kick off a \$120,000 campaign to support Kelowna's own, Food for Thought program. Together, and through the power of matching funds, we will help fund their Weekend Backpack Program for the entire 2021/2022 school year.

The **Weekend Backpack Program** assists children that are most at-risk in our community by providing them with healthy food packaged in a backpack to take home on weekends.

As we all know, hunger doesn't take the weekend off. Food insecurity in the Central Okanagan has increased by 39% during the COVID pandemic.

Peter Boyd, owner of Peter's Independent Grocers, and Al Hildebrandt, Founder of Impact Tomorrow Foundation, are working together on the Food for Thoughts' Backpack program, with their personal and financial support and they are asking you to join them in their quest to raise \$120,000. https://trellis.org/impacttomorrow_foodforthought



Kids and their families continue to face a lot of uncertainty. Each week, Food for Thought's 53 volunteers gather to package nutritional food items for their Breakfast Program and Weekend Backpack Program. Working across School District 23, the Breakfast Program serves 1,700 children per day who without this assistance go to school on an empty stomach. The program helps support a healthy start to the day and the nutrition required to learn and engage while ensuring they have the energy they need to get through each school day.

Food for Thought serves local elementary, middle, and secondary students families facing challenges and working hard to support these children and fill the hunger gap. The Backpack contains fresh vegetables, fruit, snacks, and enough nutritious food to last the weekend and into the school week.

British Columbia has one of the highest child poverty rates in Canada with 20% of children living below the poverty line. With the ever-increasing cost of rent, food, and other household expenses, families in our community are struggling to keep food on the table throughout the week. It's often embarrassing for children attending school to not be like their peers with a full and assorted lunch box. Equipping these children with a Weekend Backpack full of nutritious food helps reduced stress and gives them energy to learn, play, and grow.











It's hard to believe that In the Central Okanagan, there are over 5,900 children at risk of food insecurity. Food For Thought's Weekend Backpack Program is a necessity for children experiencing hunger which generates positive changes in schools, communities, and our society. Proper access to nutrition is shown to improve capacity to learn, reduces stress and anxiety, boost attendance and punctuality, foster student's sense of engagement and belonging, while promoting greater nutritional awareness.

The Annual cost to execute the Weekend Backpack Program in response to recognized needs is \$150,000. At this time, 20% has already been raised.

Cheryl Hoffman, Food for Thought Coordinator, notes "We need to raise \$120,000 in the next 3 months so we can safeguard the program for the 2021/2022 school year. Too many children in our community come to school on Monday having not eaten much over the weekend. Raising money during this Covid season for these often-forgotten children and families is not easy; we want to make certain children in our community are given every chance to succeed."

When schools closed at the start of COVID, children relied on Food for Thought for stability and nutrition during these challenging times. Together we can make a difference and brighten their days!

The Impact Tomorrow Foundation has generously agreed to match each dollar raised up to \$60,000. The impact of this campaign will ensure over 5,000 backpacks are delivered this school year, to children at risk. Each Weekend Backpack of food which contains 9 meals and extra snacks so that a child has more than enough to make a difference.


