Get a head start on your career.

ITA's youth programs let you apprentice for a trade—and earn credits and money at the same time.



SSA and ACE-IT

Sign up for ACE IT (*Accelerated Credit Enrolment in Industry Training*) and SSA (*Secondary School Apprenticeship*) and start your career while you're still in high school.

Apprenticeships combine classroom instruction with on-the-job training, so you'll be applying your skills and earning a pay cheque while you learn. By the time you graduate, you'll be on your way to completing your first year of apprenticeship—and beginning a satisfying career that pays well.

SAVE TIME AND MONEY

ACE-IT and SSA save you money. You'll get your first year of post-secondary training free, and you may be eligible for a \$1,000 scholarship.

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ACCELERATED CREDIT ENROLMENT IN INDUSTRY TRAINING

Begin technical training for an apprenticeship program while you're still in high school. As an ACE IT participant, you'll attend a trades training class—usually at a college—and receive dual credit for your time. Best of all, there is no tuition fee!

You'll graduate from the ACE IT program with credits that count towards your high-school diploma and at least one level of technical training for your industry training program.



To be eligible for ACE-IT, you must be:

- Currently attending high school.
- Prepared to finish the training within three months of graduating.
- Under the age of 20 when you complete the program.

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SECONDARY SCHOOL APPRENTICE

Begin work-based training for an apprenticeship program while you're still in high school. As an SSA participant, you'll "earn while you learn" and get credits towards your high-school diploma and apprenticeship. Your school's career counsellor can tell you more about the types of work that qualify.

You'll graduate from the SSA program with 16 high-school credits and 480 work-based training hours that count towards your trade credential. Plus, you might be eligible for a \$1,000 scholarship.



To be eligible for SSA, you must be:

- School aged (19 or under by June 30th)

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
