THE SEL SCOOP – January 2021 Supporting your Child Socially and Emotionally



For many reasons beyond our control, life can feel stressful right now. Here are a few tips to help your chil manage when big and uncomfortable feelings show up :

Talk about Emotions

Being able to identify, name, and talk about feelings reduces input from the emotion center of the brain and increases input from the thinking and problem solving center of the brain. It is also helpful to practice noticing emotions as physical sensations (literally, feelings)!



Listen and Empathize

Validate their feelings, judgement free – all feelings are okay, but all behaviour is not! You don't have to agree with what they might be feeling, but it is important to listen and respect it. Ask open-ended questions ("tell me what that feels like"; "tell me more". Ask prompting questions "What do you think would happen if ...")



Reframe Stress & Encourage a Growth Mindset Help children shift from a "stress hurts" to a "stress helps" mindset. Stress, big or small, presents opportunities for growth and learning. Even though a situation can't always be fixed, every situation can be improved - help them identify the powers they have to influence things.



Acknowledge your own Feelings

It's helpful for children to see that everyone strugales. even arown-ups. Model talking about feelings, talking about how feelings show up in the body, thinking through solutions, and using healthy coping strategies that make problems better, not worse! Choose self-disclosures carefully and keep adults worries in the hands of adults!



Reframe Feelings as Messages

Feelings are simply pieces of information that we have the power to choose what to do with. We don't want to ignore feelings but we don't want to respond impulsively to them either. Help them learn to interpret the message - stop and think, and make a good choice.





Notice What They are Doing Well Praise effort more than outcome. When offering ositive feedback, be specific (identifying a clear desired behaviour that you would like to see repeated) and legitimate (following purposeful and meaningful accomplishments or actions and contributions). Encourage your child to think of how far he or she has come rather than how far he or she still needs to go. Help them see what they can do



Teach and Practice Problem Solving Skills What am I feeling? What is the Problem? What are the possible solutions? What would happen if...? (weigh the pros and cons). What will I try? Did it work? Practice stress management techniques such as deep breathing, distraction, movement, and positive



Give them Choice

Having a sense of agency, purpose, and control in a situation that may otherwise feel very much out of their control can be helpful. This could as simply as choosing what activities to do when, what to have for meals, what they want to wear, what movie to watch during family movie night. Some kids may need controlled choice (options limited to 2 or 3)



What we give Attention to Grows What we focus on, we get more of - choosing to focus on the positives, the learning opportunities, what is within our control, and the ways that we can make a small improvement in a given situation is empowering!



Talk Openly About Change Remind your child of a time when they successfully coped with a major change, limitation, or uncomfortable situation in the past (starting a new school, joining a new team). How did it feel, how did they cope, how did

In your web browser type: https://enrollment.sd23.bc.ca

No internet access? Go directly to a school on February 1st or later to complete the online application. Assistance will be provided.

PLEASE NOTE: The application process is online only, no paper enrollment is available. You are required to have a valid email account.

Applications will be assigned a date-time stamp on a first-come, first-served basis, which will factor into a student's placement priority.

Complete the online application as early as possible, and provide the required documents listed below <u>directly to the school</u> either in person or by email by **Friday**, **March 12**, **2021**.

- 1. Birth certificate or other government issued proof of age and citizenship
- 2. Proof of B.C. Residency
 - a. BC driver's license of parent/legal guardian AND
 - b. BC CARE card of parent/legal guardian OR
 - c. Other supporting documentation http://www.sd23.bc.ca/DistrictInfo/schoolenrollment/
- 3. Proof of Student's Living Address
 - a. Property ownership, lease or rental agreement OR recent utility bill

AFTER Thursday, September 2, 2021

New in-catchment area enrollments: Parents will be notified by a confirmation email when the school has accepted the student's application for enrollment. Board Policy 405R – Student Placement (Regulations), will be used to determine student placement and priority.

New out-of-catchment area enrollments: Parents <u>may not</u> be notified until after the summer enrollment period is over and all in-catchment area students have been placed.

Qualifying age: The School Act requires that a child must be five years of age by December 31, 2021 to qualify for school enrollment in September 2021. No exceptions.

CONSIDERATIONS WHEN PLANNING GRADE 11 and 12

- UBC recommends 6 grade 12 level classes, academic and/or nonacademic to demonstrate course load. (English 12 + 5) This is separate from all other transcript assessments.
