

Accident Insurance

Central Okanagan Public Schools does not insure expenses for <u>student injuries</u> that occur on school grounds or during school activities. Parents and guardians can voluntarily purchase private accident insurance. The Kids Plus Accident Insurance Program that was previously offered to our students was discontinued in 2019. The IA Financial Group now offers the Family Accident Reimbursement Plan (FARP) which is a voluntary plan that provides coverage for students and their families against accidental injury, unexpected medical expenses and critical illness.

TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION WEEK

KSS staff received orange shirts distributed by our Indigenous Academy students this week to wear for Truth and Reconciliation Week. The art on the shirt was created by local artist, Coralee Miller, of WFN, and she has graciously granted her permission to have the image used for the orange shirts this year.

Wearing orange together on September 29th, leading up to the newly established holiday on September 30th, is a small yet very important acknowledgement that we can do together in support of residential school survivors. We encourage all KSS community members to wear orange on **September 29th.**

"In recent years, Sept. 30 has been known as Orange Shirt Day, so called because of the residential school experiences of the campaign's founder, Phyllis Webstad. It is a day when we honour the children who suffered in the residential school system, and many residential school survivors and supporters have advocated for this to become a national day of commemoration, to respond to one of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action."*


