On-line Report Cards at KSS

All students should log in and make sure they have access before that time. Instructions are below and a more detailed powerpoint is also available here on the KSS website.

Student MyEd Portal link: CLICK HERE

Login ID: stu23firstname.lastname

Password: copy and paste from e-mail sent to your @learnaccount (Passwords are case sensitive)

- Creating a password: Your password can't contain any parts of your name or birthday, and must include a capital letter, lowercase letter, number and symbol.
- After too many unsuccessful attempts, your account will be disabled and you will need to e-mail the office to have it reset during school hours: KelownaSecondary.School@sd23.bc.ca





Once your student is logged in to the student portal they will see their student schedule under Published Reports (see below)

This is also where they will see their report card when it is published on November 24th.



StudentTranscripts Service

Information For Students

StudentTranscripts Service (STS) is an online application for students to view their school marks, transcripts, scholarships and send transcripts electronically to post secondary institutions and employers.



Get Started

To register for STS

- Personal Education Number (PFN)
- Full legal name Date of birth
- Email address
- Step

 Go to the Ministry of Education's Transcripts and Certificate website at http://www.StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca.
- Step Z You must sign up for a BCeID before you can use the StudentTranscripts Service. For BCeID signup, you need to: Sign Up for a BCeID
 - Complete the fields to register for a basic BCeID
 - Select your password reset questions and answers (remember these as you will need them if you forget your password)
 - Follow the system prompts and sign up for StudentTranscripts Service.
- Step 3 Log-in to StudentTranscripts Service using your BCelD.

When registering for the Student Transcript Service using your BCeID, you will be prompted to:

- Enter your student information used by your school (see Get Started information above)
- Read the personal data collection info and complete the process by clicking "submit"
- An email will be sent to the email address provided and must be activated within 24 hours of receipt or you will need to complete the registration process again
- Once activated, you will be able to log onto STS using your BCeID and password.

Log in with BCeID

Step 4 From your STS Dashboard, you can choose your post-secondary institutions (PSIs) selections, preview, send and order transcripts, view exam and assessment results and view scholarship information. Please note that all transcripts previewed in the STS are considered unofficial, but official transcripts will be sent out when ordered.

> You will need to consent to the STS privacy notice which enables the ministry to send your transcripts to your selected PSIs by paper or electronically depending on how the PSI is able to receive transcripts. Printed copies of transcripts may take up to 3 weeks for processing and delivery to your selected PSIs.

Grad 2023 Winter Formal Information


We are excited to see as many grads as possible on Wednesday, November 23 at KSS. A few things to remember:

- Students suspected of intoxication will not be admitted and parents/guardians will be contacted immediately


Above all, be prepared with comfortable footwear

When: Friday, November 25th, 2022 at 4pm – 5:30pm


Where: Kelowna Rotary Centre for the Arts



WORKSHOPS + TRAINING

We offer workshops for parents and caregivers whose child/youth has been a patient in a psychiatric unit. It's really tough when your child is struggling and ends up in crisis - and we want to help.

We also offer training that brings together young people, parents/caregivers and professionals to learn with and from each other to help experiences between them go better.
