Safety of your Child at Non-Sanctioned Graduation Events

For each of our grade 12 students, the graduation year is one of the most special and celebrated milestones to date. We have several events that we organize and support at KSS for your Grade 12 student. Administrators, teachers, parents and students work very hard to organize these events and ensure all safety concerns are addressed. Grad Winter Formal, Grad Movie Night, Grad Spaghetti Dinner, Prom and the Convocation Ceremony are just a few activities that we plan and prepare for your child's enjoyment.

Unfortunately, there are other <u>non-sanctioned grad events</u> that we do not supervise nor support. These activities are often organized and arranged by the graduates themselves and include "grad kidnappings" and subsequent "bush parties" that take place in our community.

We need to emphasize our serious concerns regarding student behavior and safety at all of the above-mentioned non-sanctioned events, as there have been incidents of serious injury in past years.

The staff at KSS want your child's grade 12 year to be positive, memorable and safe, and we strongly caution and counsel parents to investigate these non-sanctioned activities carefully.




Get Involved in Career Experiences!



Health Care Careers Conference – Kelowna General Hospital

Career-Life Programs was pleased to see this opportunity open-up again for Central Okanagan Public School's Grade 11 & 12 students, who had an amazing day of learning exploring various careers at Kelowna General Hospital on March 12th. The conference was well attended with 100 students from each of the high schools. Students had the opportunity to investigate careers in the areas of health and technology within a hospital setting. They listened to presentations by staff in many departments that contribute to the successful operation of the hospital including a physician, a medical lab assistant, a health care assistant, a medical device reprocessing technician, a respiratory therapist, a physical therapist, an occupational therapist, a recreation therapist, a medical imaging technician, a nurse, information technology and volunteer services. Students also had the chance to tour multiple hospital departments.

RE: 2025-2026 School Calendar

Dear Parents/Guardians and School Community:

The Ministry of Education passed Bill 36, the School Amendment Act, which eliminated the Standard School Calendar. As a result, school districts are now required to establish their own school calendars. The Calendar Committee is comprised of representatives of partner groups in the Central Okanagan Public Schools, including the Central Okanagan Teachers' Association (C.O.T.A.), the Canadian Union of Public Employees Local 3523 (C.U.P.E.), the Central Okanagan Principals' and Vice-Principals' Association (COPVPA), and the Central Okanagan Parent Advisory Council (COPAC). This committee met to draft a proposed 2025/2026 school calendar (attached), which meets the requirements of Bill 36.

Section 87.01 (7) of the School Act requires consultation on school calendars. A board must make public a proposed school calendar one month before submitting it to the Ministry. We are inviting the community to review the proposed calendar for the 2025/2026 school year and to provide input to the proposal before it is discussed by our Board of Education at a public meeting.

I invite you to provide your input about this proposal by Friday, April 5, 2024, by completing a very brief survey at the link below:

We anticipate that the finalized 2025/2026 school calendar (once approved by the Board of Education) will be provided to parents/guardians later this spring. Copies will be provided directly to you through your child's school.

The minimum hours of instruction are:

•	Kindergarten	853 hours	(based on 288 minutes X 183)
•	Grades 1-6	878 hours	(based on 288 minutes X 183)
•	Grades 7-12	952 hours	(based on 313 minutes X 183)

Provides the:

- number and dates of the days in session
- the number and dates of each day of instruction
- vacation periods and the Statutory Holidays
- the dates of each Non-Instructional Day
- the number of hours of instruction offered students in each grade group
