

Password: copy and paste from e-mail sent to your @learnaccount (Passwords are case sensitive)

- Creating a password: Your password can't contain any parts of your name or birthday, and must include a capital letter, lowercase letter, number and symbol.
- After too many unsuccessful attempts, your account will be disabled and you will need to e-mail the office to have it reset during school hours: KelownaSecondary.School@sd23.bc.ca




Once your student is logged in to the student portal they will see their student schedule under Published Reports (see below)

This is also where they will see their report card when it is published on November 25th.









A few friendly reminders about student attendance and sign out.:

- Students are not able to leave school without parent or guardian permission. They can't "sign themselves out". We are <u>NOT</u> able to accept notes or text messages.
- Please enter your students early dismissal in school messenger. If you are aware of an
 appointment you can enter it in advance. The teacher will see that they are excused
 early and they can leave their class at that time.


