SUBJECT: KSS Communicable Disease Prevention Plan – STUDENTS

EFFECTIVE DATE: January 4, 2022

We are currently following the Provincial COVID-19 Communicable Disease Guidelines for K-12 Settings

- Use hand sanitizer or wash hands upon entry to KSS and regularly throughout the day.
- No gatherings larger than 50% operating capacity. No spectators.
- Routine daily health check (self-screening) continue this. Do not enter KSS if you answer 'yes'
 to any of the symptoms on the <u>Daily Health Check</u>
- Non-medical masks are required in all indoor areas
 - Even while seated
 - Except when eating / drinking (must be properly physically distanced)
- No Food / Drink consumption in hallways (ie: masks must stay on)
- MPR closed for eating / sitting / visiting (except for meetings with counsellors)
- Washroom capacity limits will be posted (4 per student washroom downstairs, 2 per student washroom upstairs, and 1 per universal washroom) *reminder to wear mask in washroom
- PE changeroom capacity limited to one class at a time
- Lunch Break:
 - Students may go to a classroom for lunch, or walk outdoors
 - Library is open (observe maximum capacity of 50)
 - MPR is closed
- Okanagan College <u>no KSS student access at this time</u>. <u>Students may pass through, but must continue on their way</u>, or wait at the bus stop, but may not hang out.
- Food: No sharing of homemade food / baked goods
- Sharing of educational tools: sanitize hands after using shared items.
- Elevator: Maximum two occupants only & must wear masks.
- What if someone is feeling sick while at school? The individual may be asked to go home.

Please refer to the <u>updated District Communicable Disease Plan</u> and continue to follow local health guidelines.

Extreme fatigue or tiredness	Stay home for 24 hours. If symptoms don't get better or get worse,
Nausea or vomiting	contact a health care provider or call 8-1-1 about your symptoms and
Diarrhea	next steps.
INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL:	WHAT TO DO
Have you returned from travel outside Canada in the last 14 days?	If yes: Fully vaccinated students, staff and other adults who have travelled outside of Canada may qualify for the fully vaccinated traveller exemption. Students, staff and other adults who are not fully vaccinated and have travelled outside of Canada CANNOT attend school for 14 days after arrival, as part of federal requirements.
CLOSE CONTACT	WHAT TO DO
Have you been notified by public health that you are a close contact of a person	If yes: Follow the instructions provided by Public Health.

You can also check your symptoms with the K-12 Health Check or the BC Self-Assessment Tool.

Call 8-1-1 with any questions about symptoms of illness. If you have severe symptoms, like difficulty breathing (struggling to breathe or you can only speak single words) or chest pain, call 9-1-1 or go to the nearest Emergency Department.



Create a Netlink ID

Once you've applied, create your Netlink ID at uvic.ca/netlink. This will become your @uvic.ca email address while you're a student. You'll also use your Netlink ID to access the UVic student portal where you'll self-report your grades, apply for scholarships and register for your course

Submit supplemental information

Prepare your supplemental information (if required) and submit it by your program's supplemental application deadline. This is usually January 31 or earlier. You can find these requirements and deadline on your program's page at uvic.ca/programs.

Submit proof of English language proficiency

If your first language isn't English, submit proof of English language proficiency by February 28 or the deadline indicated in your application checklist uvic.ca/enpr

Self-report your grades between February 15 and March 15

Self-report your interim grades or predicted IB scores via the link in the checklist in the UVic application portal. uvic.ca/application By self-reporting your grades, you will be automatically considered for entrance scholarships based solely on your calculated admission average. You must self-report your grades to be considered for admission or scholarships at UVic.

Apply for on-campus housing between February 7 and May 1

Hoping to live on campus? Apply between February 7 and May 1 at <u>uvic.ca/residence</u>.

Apply for specific-criteria application awards

You can apply for specific-criteria application awards (based on grades and merit) as of February 15. You can apply before you've received an admission offer, but make sure to submit your application before the deadline of April 30. uvic.ca/entrancescholarships

Accept your offer!

We'll send your offer of admission by email. Be sure to read all information carefully and pay the acceptance deposit by the deadline specified in your offer. Doing so will reserve your seat at UVic and enable you to register for classes. uvic.ca/admitted

Apply for a study permit, if required

If you're not a Canadian citizen or permanent resident, apply for your study permit as early as possible to allow for processing time. You can apply for your permit at canada.ca/immigration. You must pay your acceptance deposit bef you can receive a study permit letter from UVic. uvic.ca/admitted

Register for courses

Watch your email between late May and early June for registration information including when to log in to find out your registration date and time.

Send final grades to UVic

Send your final official grades plus any other requested documents by the deadline listed in the UVic application portal uvic.ca/final-grades
