Safety of your Child at Non-Sanctioned Graduation Events

For each of our grade 12 students, the graduation year is one of the most special and celebrated milestones to date. We have several events that we organize and support at KSS for your Grade 12 student. Administrators, teachers, parents and students work very hard to organize these events and ensure all safety concerns are addressed. Grad Winter Formal, Grad Fun Night, Prom and the Convocation Ceremony are just a few activities that we plan and prepare for your child's enjoyment.

Unfortunately, there are other <u>non-sanctioned grad events</u> that we do not supervise nor support. The activities are organized and arranged by graduates themselves that include "grad kidnappings" and subsequent "bush parties" that take place in our community.

We want to be clear that we have serious concerns regarding student behavior and safety at all of the above-mentioned non sanctioned events. There has been incidents of serious injury to students and we strongly caution and counsel parents to investigate these non-sanctioned activities carefully.

The staff at KSS want your child's grade 12 year to be positive, memorable and safe.

The KSS Parents Advisory Council is devastated by the tragic loss of three of our grade 12 students this week, and we share our grief with all students, staff, and families who have been affected by this heartbreaking tragedy. Words cannot adequately express our heartfelt condolences to our KSS community, and in particular the graduation class. Our hope is that we will all find strength and comfort in our community. 

UBC UPDATES:

May is an exciting time for your students as many of them will be making their final university decisions for the fall. Here are some important resources to help you navigate the home stretch.

Deadline to accept offers of admission

Students can find the date by which to accept their offer in the <u>Student Service Centre</u>. Generally the deadline to accept an offer of admission from UBC Okanagan is **June 1**, and some students admitted to the Vancouver campus have been given extensions to the May 1 deadline. Students can accept their offer and pay their acceptance deposit in the Student Service Centre.

Next steps for admitted students

Students who have received an offer of admission from UBC might be wondering what's next. Our <u>after vou've been admitted page</u> offers a step-by-step guide and video to help admitted students plan their finances, secure housing, figure out course planning, and complete other crucial tasks between now and September.

Orientation options for new students

Once your students have accepted their offer to UBC, they're ready to start thinking about the orientation options available to them this summer. Together, these orientations are designed to help them meet their first friends, get familiar with their new campus, and feel confident in their academic readiness so they have more time to focus on what matters in September.

International study permits

International students attending high school in Canada (who are not Canadian citizens or permanent residents of Canada) should obtain a post-secondary study permit to study at UBC. That will involve changing the conditions on their current permit. If your students will be arriving to UBC from a different country, more guidance can be found on the coming from abroad page.

UBC's national mailout goes digital

In keeping with UBC's sustainability goals we are pivoting our print publications into a digital format. Instead of shipping out packages to all the school across the country we will be sharing our recruiter contact sheet, Prospective Undergraduate Guide and other information about programs and awards in a digital format. This new, centralized delivery will make it easier to share information with colleagues and students.
