

On-line Report Cards at KSS

We are very happy to announce that KSS is moving to on-line reporting starting with our first report cards on November 25. Our Grade 11 and 12 students have already activated their accounts to access their schedules. On Monday, we will send an invite and password to our Grade 10 and new students to activate their accounts.

Passwords will be sent to their @learnaccount ON MONDAY. Instructions are below

Password: copy and paste from e-mail sent to your @learnaccount (Passwords are case sensitive)

- Creating a password: Your password can't contain any parts of your name or birthday, and must include a
 capital letter, lowercase letter, number and symbol.
- ♦ After too many unsuccessful attempts, your account will be disabled and you will need to e-mail the office to have it reset during school hours: KelownaSecondary.School@sd23.bc.ca





A few friendly reminders about student attendance and sign out.:

Our District (and our Province) have been really stressing the importance of Career Life, Mentorship and a variety of student experiences in all areas of education. Our District and School Goals are to provide as many experiences as possible for our students, with particular emphasis on authentic career research. Our District has identified that these experiences would be:

Program Shadows – these would be related to any Dual Credit program…students would connect with Mr. Parmar regarding these opportunities.

Job Shadows – these would be district approved experiences…students must connect with Ms. Gross regarding these opportunities.

Virtual Job Shadows – these are new to our district in light of our current environment...students would connect with Ms. Gross.

Indigenous Elder Experiences – these are new to our school and Mr. Sodaro will continue to work with our Indigenous Education Department on these.

Career Spotlights – these will be offered to students in a variety of ways, including in person/zoom here at KSS or visits to UBCO/OUC, etc...

All of these Career Life Mentorship Experiences would be considered authentic career research, which meets the District and Ministry goals for our graduating students. 
