
The Course Request Deadline is Friday, February 28th for incoming Grade 10s.

Network

Currently École Kelowna Secondary School is a candidate school in the UNESCO Associated School Network (ASPnet). We look forward to gaining full member-**Unesco** ship once we are able to share all of the amazing things that happen at our school.

The UNESCO Associated Schools Network consists of close to 10,000 schools across 181 countries. Within this network there are 100 Canadian UNESCO schools from across 8 provinces and the Yukon Territory. As part of this network we will work with schools from across the country and around the world to promote the ideals of UNESCO valuing rights and dignity, gender equality, social progress, freedom, justice and democracy, respect for diversity, and international solidarity.

At KSS we will communicate and observe multiple UNESCO days, and make classroom and school connections to the 17 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. Furthermore, we will focus on the following thematic areas outlined by the Canadian Commission for UNESCO:

- ⇒ Education for all
- ⇒ Global Citizenship Education
- ⇒ Reconciliation
- ⇒ Education for Sustainable Development

The UNESCO Associated Schools Network will provide us an excellent platform to highlight all the great things we do within the school and the broader community. Health Nurse Wellness Clinics in School Settings for Grade 10, 11, 12 Students

To students & their parents, guardians, or representatives:

As part of Interior Health (IH) - Central Okanagan's efforts to provide access to public health nursing (PHN) support and services, IH will be offering <u>in-school</u> PHN Wellness Clinics for grade 10, 11, & 12 students between now and the end of this school year.

During the Wellness Clinics in the school, Public Health Nurses will be available to talk with students and answer any questions about public health nursing services, such as health and wellness promotion/disease prevention information, and resources. This is also a great opportunity for senior high school students to meet with a public health nurse to assess their immunization history and ensure they have all the necessary vaccinations before they graduate. Some post-secondary schools/training programs require immunization history prior to starting the program. Additionally, based on information gleaned from the recent 2023 McCreary Adolescent Survey indicating a growing concern from students regarding a variety of health-related topics, these in-school clinics will offer improved access for students to reach out to a health professional. COVID-19 or Influenza vaccines will not be offered or provided at these Wellness Clinics.





Monday March 10 and Tuesday March 11 9am - 4pm


