Safety of your Child at Non-Sanctioned Graduation Events

For each of our grade 12 students, the graduation year is one of the most special and celebrated milestones to date. We have several events that we organize and support at KSS for your Grade 12 student. Administrators, teachers, parents and students work very hard to organize these events and ensure all safety concerns are addressed. Grad Winter Formal, Grad Movie Night, Grad Spaghetti Dinner, Prom and the Convocation Ceremony are just a few activities that we plan and prepare for your child's enjoyment.

Unfortunately, there are other <u>non-sanctioned grad events</u> that we do not supervise nor support. These activities are often organized and arranged by the graduates themselves and include "grad kidnappings" and subsequent "bush parties" that take place in our community.

We need to emphasize our serious concerns regarding student behavior and safety at all of the above-mentioned non-sanctioned events, as there have been incidents of serious injury in past years.

The staff at KSS want your child's grade 12 year to be positive, memorable and safe, and we strongly caution and counsel parents to investigate these non-sanctioned activities carefully.

He has been one of the few students nationally selected for the House of Commons Page program! We are thrilled to congratulate Blake and celebrate one of our French Immersion Graduates on this significant accomplishment!

The House of Commons Page Program:

"Each year, 40 students are selected from across Canada to participate in the Page Program. Pages are first-year students registered at one of the eligible post-secondary institutions in the national capital region. They work on a part-time basis for one year.

In the chamber and around Parliament Hill, pages support parliamentary democracy by providing a range of services to members of Parliament. This incredible work experience broadens their knowledge of the rich traditions of the Canadian parliamentary system."

Ministry Assessments at KSS Updates

As you know, to graduate in B.C. with a Dogwood Graduation Certificate, students need to complete 3 Ministry Assessments:

- Literacy 10
- Numeracy 10
- Literacy 12

Students are scheduled to write these in grade 10 English and Math classes as well as English 12 classes. Opportunities to write in are scheduled in November, January, April, and June each year.

Results from the November and January assessments are available to students on their MyEducationBC portal. Results from the January session are also posted in the KSS Multipurpose Room by student identification number.

The upcoming April session (April $24^{th} - 28^{th}$) will have students in grade 10 Math classes writing in class. Semester 2 Literacy assessments will be written in Grade 10 and 12 English classes in June. Make - up assessments for students who missed previous assessments or want to take one of the assessments are also able to sign-up with KSS Vice Principal Jeff Prasad at the office, or by email jeff.prasad@sd23.bc.ca for the April session.

NON-GRAD LIST

In order to participate in Grad, students must have returned any overdue library or text-books, paid any outstanding student fees (including \$75 grad fee) and be in a calculable position to graduate. Students that have not met all of these requirements will be placed on the Non-Grad List.

If students are on the Non-Grad List, they may make arrangements with their alpha VP for an academic plan and/or a fee payment plan.

We will be posting the Non-Grad List in the MPR next week. The list will be sorted by PUPIL NUMBER. Please have your Grad check the list and take care of any outstanding fees.

Prom tickets will go on sale on April 17th in the MPR. The cost has not yet been set. Once the cost has been confirmed, we will share this information with parents/students. If students are on the Non-Grad List, they will not be able to purchase prom tickets.


