Congratulations to Vice-Principal **Christey Hughes** who has been appointed Principal at Dorothea Walker Elementary School, beginning March 31.


A few words from Mme. Hughes:

Health Nurse Wellness Clinics in School Settings for Grade 10, 11, 12 Students

To students & their parents, guardians, or representatives:

As part of Interior Health (IH) - Central Okanagan's efforts to provide access to public health nursing (PHN) support and services, IH will be offering <u>in-school</u> PHN Wellness Clinics for grade 10, 11, & 12 students between now and the end of this school year.

During the Wellness Clinics in the school, Public Health Nurses will be available to talk with students and answer any questions about public health nursing services, such as health and wellness promotion/disease prevention information, and resources. This is also a great opportunity for senior high school students to meet with a public health nurse to assess their immunization history and ensure they have all the necessary vaccinations before they graduate. Some post-secondary schools/training programs require immunization history prior to starting the program. Additionally, based on information gleaned from the recent 2023 McCreary Adolescent Survey indicating a growing concern from students regarding a variety of health-related topics, these in-school clinics will offer improved access for students to reach out to a health professional. COVID-19 or Influenza vaccines will not be offered or provided at these Wellness Clinics.







Careers in Health Care Conference at Kelowna General Hospital Tuesday, March 4th

Just over 100 Grade 11 and 12 students from SD23, including 20 KSS Students, had the opportunity to participate in the "Careers in Health Care Conference" organized by Interior Health at the Kelowna General Hospital this past Tuesday. Students listened to presentations given by a diverse group of 12 professionals such as a physician, physiotherapist, health care assistant, midwife, respiratory, occupational and recreational therapists, and medical imaging and bio medical technicians. The experience provided students with not only practical information about working in a number of different settings such as in the hospital, community clinics and in private health care services, they also heard about real-world experiences and how working in health care, both with patients and in other areas, means making a difference in people's lives. Students also learned about ways that they can volunteer at KGH. With health care opportunities rapidly growing, the goal of the conference was to inspire high school students to consider careers in the continually changing health sector and how the range of skills and experiences can lead in many different directions, which is why health care is a unique and rewarding career.
