Indigenous-Focused Course Graduation Requirement

Essential Information



COMMON QUESTIONS



Q: Are these courses recognized at postsecondary institutions?

A: Yes, the English and Social Studies options satisfy the BC Dogwood Diploma, and are recognized across Canada.



Q: Who will teach these courses?

A: Teachers who are trained to teach in the related content area, as exists in the K-12 system currently.



Q: Why is this being put in place now? A: In October 2021, Government directed the Ministry of Education and Childcare as part of the commitments in the <u>BC Tripartite</u> <u>Education Agreement</u>.

The introduction of this graduation requirement is an important next step towards Truth & Reconciliation & supports the commitment to develop the "Educated Citizen."

WHAT IS REQUIRED?



Students graduating with a BC Dogwood Diploma will need to complete 4 credits of an Indigenous-focused course.

WHY IS THIS IN PLACE?



Develops understandings of cultures, histories, contexts and perspectives of Indigenous peoples of BC.



Part of the Framework for Reconciliation Action Plan in BC includes a commitment to implementing a course related to First Peoples as part of BC's graduation requirements.

Good to Know:

There is no increase to the number of graduation credits, which remain at 80.

Double Duty:



English First Peoples, Contemporary Indigenous Studies & BC First Peoples also satisfy **EITHER** the English Language Arts 12 **OR** Social Studies 12 requirement respectively (2 grad requirements at once).

Current Course Options:

- English First Peoples 10-12
- BC First Peoples 12
- Contemporary Indigenous Studies 12

Possible Future Courses:

Currently, there are locally developed courses being put forward for approval to fulfil this requirement. More info to come.






Make Up

Natural is best for great photos.


Use a bit of loose powder to remove shine and a bit of concealer to lighten up dark spots and cover blemishes



StudentTranscripts Service **Information For Students**

StudentTranscripts Service (STS) is an online application for students to view their school marks, transcripts, scholarships and send transcripts electronically to post secondary institutions and employers.



Step 1 Go to the Ministry of Education's Transcripts and Certificate website at http://www.StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca.

Step 2 You must sign up for a BCeID before you can use the StudentTranscripts Service. For BCeID signup, you need to: Sign Up for a BCeID

Complete the fields to register for a basic BCeID

- Select your password reset questions and answers

(remember these as you will need them if you forget your password)

- Follow the system prompts and sign up for StudentTranscripts Service.

Step 3 Log-in to StudentTranscripts Service using your BCeID.

When registering for the Student Transcript Service using your BCeID, you will be prompted to: - Enter your student information used by your school (see **Get Started** information above)

- Read the personal data collection info and complete the process by clicking "submit"
- An email will be sent to the email address provided and must be activated within
- 24 hours of receipt or you will need to complete the registration process again
- Once activated, you will be able to log onto STS using your BCeID and password.

Log in with BCeID

Step 4 From your STS Dashboard, you can choose your post-secondary institutions (PSIs) selections, preview, send and order transcripts, view exam and assessment results and view scholarship information. Please note that all transcripts previewed in the STS are considered unofficial, but official transcripts will be sent out when ordered.

> You will need to consent to the STS privacy notice which enables the ministry to send your transcripts to your selected PSIs by paper or electronically depending on how the PSI is able to receive transcripts. Printed copies of transcripts may take up to 3 weeks for processing and delivery to your selected PSIs.
