#### **GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**



In order to participate in Graduation, Grade 12 students must have:

- ⇒ returned any overdue library or textbooks,
- ⇒ paid any outstanding student fees (including \$75 grad fee), and
- ⇒ be in a calculable position to graduate.

The "Outstanding Fees & Textbooks List" is posted in the MPR and is sorted by PUPIL NUMBER. Please have your grade 12 student check this list and take care of any outstanding fees or make arrangements with your alpha VP.

The "Non-Grad List" (academic list) will be posted in the beginning of May after Q3. If students are on the Non-Grad List, they may make an academic plan with their alpha VP.

Prom tickets will be sale the week of April 24th in the MPR at lunch If students are on either of these lists, they will not be able to purchase Prom tickets or participate in Grad.

#### FAQs:

Who can attend? KSS grade 12 students only

How do students get there? All grads must board a school bus leaving The Dolphins immediately following the promenade and arrive at Sunset Ranch together.

If I can't drive myself, how do I get home? Grads may arrange their own pick-up from Sunset ranch before 11pm, or they can indicate that they need to take a bus to KSS, Dr. Knox, or The Dolphins at intervals between 9-10:30pm.

Reminder: All KSS grads who purchase a ticket are agreeing to follow the KSS Code of Conduct for the entire evening. KSS administration will be on-site for the evening in addition to formal security and parent supervisors.

#### KSS INDIGENOUS ACADEMY

On April 20<sup>th</sup>, students from the École Kelowna Secondary School Indigenous Academy visited the Kamloops Residential School. Teacher, Mr. Rob Bennet, spent weeks preparing his Academy students for this important learning experience. Students had the extremely valuable opportunity to hear from a fifth-generation residential school survivor, Jackie Jules, Cultural Educator at Secwepemc Museum & Heritage Park. During her time with us, Jackie spent moments pointing out subtle details that may not be noticed by people walking by without a guide. Each stop during our walk included deeply poignant stories, all were informational and most were very somber.

The group was joined by Chelcy Ross, an Indigenous Educator from the Kamloops-Thompson School District. Chelcy shared her story of why she hadn't yet visited the Kamloops Residential School; it was a story of healing. It was deeply humbling that she chose her first visit to be with us, knowing that our students were also visiting for the first time. With a great deal of courage, Chelcy led Circle after our tour, allowing for each student and staff member to share reflections in a supported space. She explained that "Ground Zero" is where children were found lower on the property, near the museum and amongst the apple trees. We were not allowed to go to the area as it is an area that needs to rest and may only be visited by families of lost children or those approved to conduct investigation. Honouring circle protocol, I may not quote what the students discussed in circle, but I can share that each individual had thoughtful things to say, and many were left with transformative learning in their hearts.

It feels heavy at Kamloops Residential School. As Jackie Jules said, "We have taken back the building to show our community's strength. It is not the building's fault these bad things happened, and the truth must be told." Currently, the building houses many local Indigenous community resource offices, agencies, and food programs for local elders. Meetings take place and elders gather often on site. The space is used for celebrations and for funerals. Most importantly, the local Secwepemc People run it with dignity, purpose and care. Jackie left us with what she called a 'bright note' by saying: "The most important thing that you can each do for Reconciliation is to fight racism." The KSS Indigenous Academy students went home with many reflections and action-items, which we as their caring adults are called to support and grow alongside.





Sadly, the current Executive Board will all be leaving KSS as our kids are graduating.


#### Get in the game this summer with UBCO Heat Sport Camps!



The topic for the April meeting will be to gather input on the Ministry of Education K-12 Anti-Racism Action Plan for Central Okanagan Public Schools.


