Dear parents, guardians, and KSS grade 12 students,

As was true through the Spring of 2020, celebrating the completion of our Grads' journey through their school years remains a priority for our school community. At this time, we do not anticipate being able to gather in a group of over 3000 people at Trinity Baptist Church in a live ceremony, and we will move forward with planning a virtual ceremony which will be live-released on YouTube for our students and their families until a formal decision is made by the District. Overwhelmingly, the feed-back from 2020 families and grads after viewing our recorded ceremonies was positive. Students who are in a calculable position to graduate have had a \$75 Grad fee added to their online student accounts. These fees are meant to cover the costs associated with a recorded and streamed ceremony, including but not limited to: production cost, souvenir cap, gown and stole, keepsake diploma and 5" x 7" grad photo, commemorative photo composite, staging, security, etc. For equity, the three largest high schools in the district have all confirmed that their grad fees are in alignment.

In May, we will be posting an online sign-up for grads and **a maximum of four family members** to come to KSS over the weekend of June 5-6 to attend a brief, formal stage-crossing. A Covid-19 safety plan will be distributed in advance to protect the health of students and their families, as well as KSS staff members who will be volunteering. Students will receive their keepsake caps and gowns in advance, and this will allow grads and families to take photos and record this special occasion with creativity.

As family members will be present to view and record their graduate's stage-crossing, we will not be recording every moment; however, we will broadcast a formal production on Thursday, June 24 that will contain valedictory addresses, messages from our school principal, district officials, dignitaries, as well as a variety of celebrations of our graduates throughout their time at KSS. Please monitor the Whoo's News for a call for photographs and submissions over the next few months.

We look forward to celebrating and honouring your graduates with you in June.

THE SEL SCOOP – March 2021

Supporting your Child Socially and Emotionally

This month's topic: Skep and Screens

Proper sleep and rest is an important element of our overall health. Technology is an everyday tool in our lives these days, for learning, communication, and entertainment. But sometimes, the two don't mix. Here is some information on sleep, screens, and how they can co-exist more peacefully.

A Healthy 24 Hours Includes:



SWEAT:

- An accumulation of at least 60 minutes per day of moderate to vigorous physical activity involving a variety of aerobic activities
- Vigorous physical activities, and muscle and bone strengthening activities should each be incorporated at least 3 days per



- Light physical activity Several hours of a variety of structured and unstructured light physical activities



- Uninterrupted 9 to 11 hours of sleep per night for those aged 5–13 years 8 to 10 hours per night for those aged
- Consistent bed and wake-up times



- Sedentary behaviour
- No more than 2 hours per day of recreational screen tip
- Limited sitting for extended periods

The Importance of Sleep

Physical Benefits

- Regular, restful sleep creates an immune system that can ward
- Sleep also helps us maintain a health body weight and a healthy caloric intake, and reduces inflammation
- Children and youth who get a good night's sleep feel more energized during the day, as sleep helps to maximize muscle and athletic cerformage. performance

Cognitive Benefits

- Children and youth who sleep well tend to learn more, concentrate on
- tasks for longer, and be more creative Sleep has also been shown to improve problem-solving skills and enhance memory performance of both children and adults

Social-Emotional

Benefits

- Sleep is a key factor in our emotional health, reducing our risk of mood and anxiety problems
- A well-rested mind is A well-rested mind is better able to make positive decisions and manage stress We are more likely to maintain healthy
- relationships when we are rested and clear-headed

Online applications begin on Monday, February 1, 2021 at 7:00 am,

Schools will be open at 7:00 am to provide telephone support to parents that require assistance.

Documentation Submission Deadline: Friday, March 12, 2021

HOW TO APPLY

In your web browser type: https://enrollment.sd23.bc.ca

No internet access? Please contact your school and they will assist you with the online application.

PLEASE NOTE: The application process is online only, no paper enrollment is available. You are required to have a valid email account.

Applications will be assigned a date-time stamp on a first-come, first-served basis, which will factor into a student's placement priority.

Complete the online application as early as possible, and provide the required documents listed below directly to the school by email by Friday, March 12, 2021.

- Birth certificate or other government issued proof of age and citizenship.
- 2. Proof of B.C. Residency
 - a. BC driver's license of parent/legal guardian AND
 - b. BC CARE card of parent/legal guardian OR
 - c. Other supporting documentation http://www.sd23.bc.ca/DistrictInfo/schoolenrollment/
- 3. Proof of Student's Living Address
 - a. Property ownership, lease or rental agreement OR recent utility bill

AFTER Thursday, September 2, 2021

New in-catchment area enrollments: Parents will be notified by a confirmation email when the school has accepted the student's application for enrollment. Board Policy 405R – Student Placement (Regulations), will be used to determine student placement and priority.

New out-of-catchment area enrollments: Parents <u>may not</u> be notified until after the summer enrollment period is over and all in-catchment area students have been placed.

Qualifying age: The School Act requires that a child must be five years of age by December 31, 2021 to qualify for school enrollment in September 2021. No exceptions.
