Updated COVID protocol

We will be transitioning to the K-12 Health Check App for K-12 student use (students can also refer to the Daily Health Check form. The reason for moving to this Daily Health Check app and form is that there are now two tiers of symptoms. The first tier of symptoms requires a COVID-19 test whereas the second tier of symptoms do not, necessarily.

C∰VID-19 DAILY HEALTH CHECK If you or your child have any of the symptoms Based on current evidence, some symptoms are morelikely to be related to COVID-19 than others. listed below, follow theinstructions. **SYMPTOMS** WHAT TO DO Fever (above 38°C) Loss of sense of smell ortaste 1 or more of these symptoms: Chills Get tested and stay home. Difficulty breathing Couah (Symptoms are not related to a pre-existing condition (i.e. asthma)) If you have 1 symptom: Sore throat Extreme fatigue Stay home until you feel better. or tiredness Loss of appetite 2 or more of these symptoms: Nausea orvomiting Headache Stay home and wait 24 hours to see if you feel better. **Body aches** Get tested if not better after 24 hours. (Symptoms are not related to a pre-existing condition (i.e. asthma)) If you are a close contact* of someone who has COVID-19 and have any of the symptoms listed above: Get tested and stay home. Check your symptoms with the B.C. Self-Assessment Tool. If you have any questions, or the symptoms get worse, contact your healthcare provider or call 8-1-1. You will be notified if you are a close contact. Dear parents, guardians, and KSS grade 12 students,

As was true through the Spring of 2020, celebrating the completion of our Grads' journey through their school years remains a priority for our school community. At this time, we do not anticipate being able to gather in a group of over 3000 people at Trinity Baptist Church in a live ceremony, and we will move forward with planning a virtual ceremony which will be live-released on YouTube for our students and their families until a formal decision is made by the District. Overwhelmingly, the feed-back from 2020 families and grads after viewing our recorded ceremonies was positive. Students who are in a calculable position to graduate have had a \$75 Grad fee added to their online student accounts. These fees are meant to cover the costs associated with a recorded and streamed ceremony, including but not limited to: production cost, souvenir cap, gown and stole, keepsake diploma and 5" x 7" grad photo, commemorative photo composite, staging, security, etc. For equity, the three largest high schools in the district have all confirmed that their grad fees are in alignment.

In May, we will be posting an online sign-up for grads and **a maximum of four family members** to come to KSS over the weekend of June 5-6 to attend a brief, formal stage-crossing. A Covid-19 safety plan will be distributed in advance to protect the health of students and their families, as well as KSS staff members who will be volunteering. Students will receive their keepsake caps and gowns in advance, and this will allow grads and families to take photos and record this special occasion with creativity.

As family members will be present to view and record their graduate's stage-crossing, we will not be recording every moment; however, we will broadcast a formal production on Thursday, June 24 that will contain valedictory addresses, messages from our school principal, district officials, dignitaries, as well as a variety of celebrations of our graduates throughout their time at KSS. Please monitor the Whoo's News for a call for photographs and submissions over the next few months.

We look forward to celebrating and honouring your graduates with you in June.

Message from the International Education Department

International Education is currently looking for host families for Kelowna Secondary (KSS) students. Families with school aged children, residing in a single family home are encouraged to apply at their earliest convenience.

- Host families for boys
- Host families for girls arriving April 2021

Since September, Central Okanagan Public Schools has welcomed 282 international students into local schools. In Canada over 15,000 K-12 students have arrived safely, followed all guarantine measures, and are attending schools across the country. Students are required to submit a negative COVID-19 test taken within 72 hours of their departure from home country. There have been no cases of COVID-19 linked to international student travelers arriving to Canada to date. Canada's border remains open for students with study permits and international students travelling to our school district do so under the requirements of governments and health authorities.

No internet access? Please contact your school and they will assist you with the online application.

PLEASE NOTE: The application process is online only, no paper enrollment is available. You are required to have a valid email account.

Applications will be assigned a date-time stamp on a first-come, first-served basis, which will factor into a student's placement priority.

Complete the online application as early as possible, and provide the required documents listed below directly to the school by email by Friday, March 12, 2021.

- 1. Birth certificate or other government issued proof of age and citizenship
- 2. Proof of B.C. Residency
 - a. BC driver's license of parent/legal guardian AND
 - b. BC CARE card of parent/legal guardian OR
 - c. Other supporting documentation http://www.sd23.bc.ca/DistrictInfo/schoolenrollment/
- 3. Proof of Student's Living Address
 - a. Property ownership, lease or rental agreement OR recent utility bill

AFTER Thursday, September 2, 2021

New in-catchment area enrollments: Parents will be notified by a confirmation email when the school has accepted the student's application for enrollment. Board Policy 405R – Student Placement (Regulations), will be used to determine student placement and priority.

New out-of-catchment area enrollments: Parents <u>may not</u> be notified until after the summer enrollment period is over and all in-catchment area students have been placed.

Qualifying age: The School Act requires that a child must be five years of age by December 31, 2021 to qualify for school enrollment in September 2021. No exceptions.

Dear Parents/Guardians and School Community:

The Ministry of Education passed Bill 36, the School Amendment Act, which eliminated the Standard School Calendar. As a result, school districts are now required to establish their own school calendars. The calendar committee is comprised of representatives of the partner groups in the Central Okanagan Public Schools including the Central Okanagan Teachers' Association (C.O.T.A.), Canadian Union of Public Employees Local 3523 (C.U.P.E.), Central Okanagan Principals and Vice Principals' Association (COPVPA), and the Central Okanagan Parent Advisory Council (COPAC). This committee has met to draft a proposed school calendar (attached), which meets the requirements of Bill 36.

Section 87.01 (7) of the School act requires consultation on school calendars. A board must make public a proposed school calendar one month before submitting it to the Ministry. We are inviting the community to review the proposed calendar for the 2021/2022 school year and to provide input to the proposal before it is discussed by our Board of Education at a public meeting.

We anticipate that the finalized 2021/2022 school calendar (once approved by the Board of Education) will be provided to parents early this spring. A copy will be provided directly to you through your child's school.
