# New BC Curriculum; understanding the new Core Competencies

- Some similarities to existing curriculum but new curriculum is "concept based"
- Know, do, understand model
- Three main Core competencies; Communication, Personal & Social and Thinking
- Skills students gain in each area become the foundation for content specific knowledge and skills learned in the classroom
- Allows students to develop skills to navigate the ever-changing world outside school
- Curriculum aligned with existing "attributes" of the 21<sup>st</sup> century learner
- Implementation is a learning journey for both students and staff
- Interdepartmental teams of teachers working together on projects with students
- No longer focused on the "know" but what we've learned along the way
- Valuable/meaningful opportunities to gain knowledge and experience
- Self-assessment of Core Competencies (not sure yet what this will look like)

Meningitis Clinic; 1200 eligible at KSS to be immunized

- Completed over 900 immunizations in 2 ½ hours learned efficient process from clinics held at other schools (paperwork completed in homeroom)
- Additional Clinic being held at KSS on Thursday January 11<sup>th</sup> for those who missed
- No cases of Meningitis at KSS

Middle School changes - conversations around new contract; class size/composition

- Middle schools funded by student but High schools funded by block (additional blocks affect timetable)
- Honours classes cancelled at middle school level but all students will still have the ability to take Honours in grade 10 at KSS
- Investigating new ways of offering grade 10 honours classes within timetable Numeracy Assessment
- Grade 10 & 11 students will be writing the Numeracy Assessment at KSS this year
- 600 students writing it in January (those taking math this semester)
- Graduation requirement (assessed 1-4 on report card)
- 3 opportunities to write the assessment (24 multiple choice and 2 long answer)
- KSS is piloting assessment; students will write w/math teachers invigilating
